Sandwich Profile... Rebecca Foley and Mario Furtado

'Try something new. Try the unusual. Go somewhere interesting and fun.' These might be the bywords of Rebecca Foley and Mario Furtado. They love adventures and seek out new experiences, develop new skills, and love to learn about what others have done or are doing.

"Mario and I love going to good movies. I used to direct an Indie movie club through the Library, where we went to a foreign or independent movie once a month, and then met to discuss it after viewing it. It was a fun group, but I found I was dedicating too much time preparing notes and background material for each movie," Rebecca told me. She is a teacher who cares deeply about her students, and prepares fastidiously for them. Retirement is near, but she isn't quite ready to stop teaching. She teaches four sessions of English Second Language students at the Cape Cod Community College.



Rebecca and Mario have unusual and fascinating backgrounds. She moved all around the country while growing up: Kentucky, southern California, Washington, DC, and El Paso, Texas. She studied English Literature, Spanish and History. Finally, she received her Master's degree from the Citadel in South Carolina.

Mario was born and raised in the Azores, a citizen of Portugal. He learned horticulture, agriculture and construction business on those beautiful islands. He was recruited into the Portuguese army, and served nearly three and a half years, two of them fighting in Angola against terrorists and guerrilla

revolutionists. He learned more about politics of the world, and after building successful business in the Azores, he moved to Massachusetts in 1980. He started his own landscaping and construction business, working on homes and commercial buildings. Mario is very accomplished working with tools and in building construction. He was also active in professionally translating Portuguese to English and English to Portuguese.

After gaining her teaching certificate, Rebecca set off to see the world as well. She taught in Kenya and learned a great deal about emerging nations and the problems their populations face. She returned to take up teaching in Boston, and then on to the Cape. Rebecca has always loved dogs, and while walking her dogs each day, she met Mario, who made a point of seeing her while she was dog-walking. They were married in 2003. They moved to Sandwich in 2007, and love their home backing up to the State Forest on one side and the Heritage Gardens nearby on the other. They have worked hard to reclaim stone walls, build new flower beds and pruned shrubs around their lovely yard. They most recently built a pergola in their back yard, next to their salt water pool.

When asked about their experiences traveling, they both break into big smiles. They love new places, and continue to return to the Azores to see his family. They have seen 'all the islands' of the Caribbean, prefer to travel to Europe and cruises around the world. They have cruised on a luxury yacht from Du Bai to Singapore, from Singapore to Vietnam to Hong Kong. They loved visiting Reykjavik, Iceland and love the Scandinavian capitals, Copenhagen, Stockholm, Helsinki, and Oslo. Their smiles widen when talking about Amsterdam and Paris and Istanbul. "And," Mario exclaimed, "we still have lots of places around the United States we want to see, Niagara Falls, the Grand Canyon, Yosemite Park..."

How they will find the time is hard to imagine. Rebecca is learning knitting. They are kayaking. Mario decided to learn to play the guitar, while Rebecca decided she would learn to play piano. And they still find time to walk and play with their Portuguese Water Dog, Cocker Spaniel and Pekinese.
